## **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

## S 420 - Command and General Staff

**Course Description:** This course is designed to prepare students to function effectively as members of the Command and General Staff (C&G) on a Type 2 Incident Management Team (IMT). Students will participate in facilitated discussions, classroom exercises, and a simulated incident. Students will be evaluated by assigned coaches using an assessment and feedback rubric.

**Target Group:** Personnel desiring to be qualified in a Command or General Staff position on a Type 2 Incident Management Team.

**Course Prerequisites:** Students should have a working understanding of the ICS and the Command and General Staff positions that make up an Incident Management Team. Minimum student qualifications for S 420 include:

• L480 Organizational Leadership in the Wildland Fire Service or L-380, Fireline Leadership, or L-381, Incident Leadership or L-180, Human Factors in the Wildland Fire Service, plus completion of 40 hours in any supervision or leadership training course(s).

Completion of pre-course work assignment.
